EGG SHELLS & TOMATO PLANTS

It is hard to beat the positive effect egg shells can have in helping you grow productive tomato plants. Key is to use the right number of crushed shells in the right way. Not only can eggshells help protect the tomato from disease, but they also energize and fertilize each plant while helping to protect the plant from some damaging pests.

As incredible as using egg shells can be there are misconceptions about their true effectiveness. The simple truth is that if

you use eggshells in the right way, you will grow better tomatoes. Eggshells contain three major nutrients that tomato plants really need: calcium, magnesium, and phosphorus. With enough of each, your plants should do well. Without these three



nutrients trouble looms. It is a simple process but not as easy as throwing some broken-up shells from this morning's breakfast in a planting hole. Before we discuss how to use the shells correctly let's spend some time on the value of these three nutrients.

Calcium is by far the biggest player when it comes to a tomato plant's health and production. It is responsible for creating thick healthy cell walls in the stems and branches.



When there is plenty of calcium in the soil the plant can develop its blossoms into healthy fruit. If not, the blossom end of the fruit rots as it grows, and the fruit is ruined. This is called Blossom End Rot. The great news is that the eggshell contains about 95% calcium.

Not to be lost in the nutrient value of eggshells is the amount of available magnesium and phosphorus they provide to the plant. Magnesium is vital in powering the process of

vital in powering the process of "photosynthesis." Without it the plant can't convert the

duce the mass of blooms needed to satisfy the plant's pro-

sun's energy into the food power it needs to grow. Phosphorus meanwhile is responsible for powering blooms. Without enough phosphorus the plant can't pro-

duction potential.

Eggshells contain an amazing amount of a tomato's required nutrients. Getting those out of the shell and into the soil requires a little extra effort. One of the best ways to unleash the power of the egg shell into the plant holes allowing the nutrients to release, is to first grind the shells down into a fine powder. Shells take a long time to break down. By using a coffee grinder or a mortar and pestle to pulverize them, you will make it easier and faster to get the shell's nutrients into the soil.

The next most frequent question asked is, "How much eggshell do I place into the plant hole?" Two to three table-spoons per plant is best. You can also add in spent coffee grounds, worm castings, and/or compost to help. Add 2 tablespoons of each onto, but not in the soil around all plants but not into the hole. Mandatory no, helpful yes! But don't stop there. Once your plants are in the ground you can also sprinkle a few, (2), tablespoons of pulverized shell on top of the soil around each plant. Over the following weeks and months, the nutrients will leach into the soil to continue helping power the plant through its life cycle.

Perhaps, and best of all, is adding crushed shell to the surface in the planting area which will enable your soil to continue to hold the nutrients in the area ready until the next planting season. This process works when planting in the ground, raised beds, and containers.

You must use a properly draining container. I like to use 5-gallon plastic pails. You need to create holes to allow drainage. The soil should be replaced yearly. Why? Easy to answer. Water given to a plant in a container runs from the soil's surface to the outside through drainage holes. With each watering a certain amount of soil is washed away from the root and root hairs. As more soil is lost, there is also a loss of nutrients and water will be held closer to the root structure. When the plant shows signs of stress, we usually water more. The extra watering removes more soil and nutrients causing the plant to deteriorate faster. Root rot will occur and rapidly kill the plant. The more we try to help the more we negatively affect the plant.

Remember tomatoes do not set fruit after blooming when the average air temperature exceeds 85°F. The people who developed the plant's label don't live in Florida. They call for full sun. Down here that may be too much sun. Water evaporates from the soil more quickly. We water more, and the plant shows signs of stress, and the death spiral begins. It is hard to fix at that point. In our area more than 6 to 8 hours of sun is often damaging. Move the plant to an area that gets only 8 hours of sun max but not less than 6 hours minimum. Tomatoes do best in Zephyrhills when started right after the last frost in the spring or early October, well before the first frost occurs. Good luck.






