

PASCO LAUNCHES 9TH ANNUAL "TWO GOOD SOLES" DRIVE



Pasco County is stepping up to ensure students don't face the hurdle of worn-out footwear this school year. The 9th annual Two Good Soles Shoes and Socks Drive is underway, with Pasco County Government and Constitutional offices joining forces to collect new shoes and socks for students in Pasco County Schools.

"A simple pair of shoes and socks can make a world of difference for a child in need," said

Board of County Commissioners Chair Ron Oakley. "We're committed to supporting our students and giving them the resources they need to thrive both in

and out of the classroom."

The impact of the Two Good Soles Drive is undeniable. In 2023 alone, the initiative collected over 3,000 pairs of shoes and nearly 6,000 pairs of socks. Since its inception in 2016, the drive has provided an incredible 18,340 pairs of shoes and 45,685




pairs of socks to Pasco County students in need. Social workers distribute the donated items directly to students. To ensure students receive the most suitable footwear, organizers recommend donating new shoes (children's sizes 9 and up, and adult sizes in all variations), socks in all sizes and neutral colors, and closed-toe shoes (flip flops are not accepted).

All collected shoes and socks will be delivered to Pasco County Schools at the end of October, ensuring students start the new school year with a confident step forward. Starting in September, Southport's Women's Club will once again be collecting shoes and socks for this amazing program. So look for more information in the September newsletter.

Local pro golfer found in portajohn



Wednesday, July 31st - the body of golf instructor and retired pro golfer Norman Putts was discovered in the early morning hours in a portajohn located in proximity of hole 13 on the golf course at Southport Springs Golf & Country Club here in Zephyrhills. Putts' body was discovered at

approximately 6:30am by golf course ranger Dan Jacques. Authorities were immediately dispatched to the scene following a call from Golf Course Manager Earl Hines.

Putts was transported to Advent Hospital where he was pronounced dead upon arrival. It appears that the victim succumbed to multiple stab wounds. Authorities are investigating.

Prior to moving to Southport Springs six months ago, Putts (aka The Silver Fox) was a golf instructor at Shinnecock Hills Golf Club in Southhampton, N.Y.





BASIL

If you have thought about growing basil in containers, I hope this brief guide will help you grow different types of basil, problem free.

Basil is a must have ingredient if you make your own pesto, spaghetti sauce, or other dishes including baked fish.

It is a popular herb that can be easily grown out doors in the garden or in a container outside or indoors.


You can grow basil from seeds, starter purchase plants, or

propagation. In all honesty I have not had much luck with

propagation and use starter

plants most of the time. Regardless of how you start, having a basic knowledge of the various varieties of basil you will see in the stores can help you pick the right basil for you.

Genovese Basil is one of the most often seen in this area. It handles the weather well



Thai basil is commonly used in Asian dishes such as pho, spring rolls, some fish dishes and pasta. It is rarely found in garden centers as a starter plant. Seeds can also be difficult to find locally. You may need to find seeds on the internet.

Lemon Basil is difficult to find and grow. I found it sensitive to temperature swings. And, I have not seen

any starter plants. It is a different taste that reportedly works well on fish. Purple Basil is á showy cultivar. They can be used similar to Genovese Basil with a flavor that is not as bold. I grow it but use it as a nectar and pollen source for the many pollinators in the area. It is a favorite of bumble bees, honey bees, and other pollinators.

All basil tends to bolt (flower) quickly When as the weather warms.

flowers appear, the taste is stronger not a good thing. When buds are noticed prune or pinch below the



flower to the top of a leaf cluster below the bud. This will allow increased leaf growth, which is our target. grow Genovese Basil which we use in pasta sauce and any purple basil

to be used for the pollinators. Once it flowers, the bees will find it.

A good source for all types of basil seeds is Renee's garden seeds. I have found that the starter plants at Shannon's are the best with those from Lowes a close second.

Basil plants grow well in 8" diameter or larger containers. The larger the better. Don't over crowd them. Containers must have numerous drain holes or root rot will win. Basil grows best when the soil ph is 6 to 7.5. You can amend the potting soil with compost. Black Kow, or worm castings. Usually, a cup or cup and a half is all you

Need in an 8" diameter container. Additional fertilizer isn't

required, but you should use new soil yearly.

All basil hate soggy soil. Root Rot can occur and quickly kill the plant. Outdoors the plant may need water more often. It will vary depending on temperature, wind, and sunlight. They need 6 to 8 hours of sun per day inside or out. More sun than that down here in Central Florida may require you water every 2 to 3 days. It's best to find a location that does not over expose the leaves to excess sun light. Ninety degrees or higher




and more than 8 hours of Florida sun can be deadly. The most common problem you may see on plants growing indoors is spider mites. Spray the whole plant lightly with Neem Oil should they appear. It is best to spray outdoors. Don't use systemic insecticide treatments for control because it leaves the plant inedible. Be sure to read all labels.

I have had my best success growing basil between March and early July or mid-September to the end of December. Move the plants inside if there is a chance of freezing temperatures.




This time of year, we have greater than normal rain; so please listen to the Rangers as to the course and please obey the "Cart Path Only" days.







Vance, whose maternal grandparents were from the Appalachian territory of Kentucky, was raised in extreme poverty by his maternal grandmother. After graduating High School, Vance joined the Marine Corps and served in the Iraq war. Returning home, he attended and earned a degree in political sci-

ence from Ohio State and then went on to earn a Law degree from Yale subsequently working for the Law Firm of Sidley Austin LLP and for various investment firms. A best selling author, Vance and his wife Usha are well known for their philanthropic work with disadvantaged children.

So yes, remind your grandchildren and great grandchildren that irrespective of what they hear from their friends or what they see and read on TicToc or Instagram, here in America, if you want it and are willing to work for it, the American dream can be yours.
