STOP TREATING SOIL LIKE DIRT

We need to stop treating soil like dirt! Pheobe Weston, a biodiversity journalist for The Guardian, a British daily newspaper writes, "Hidden under our feet is a miniature landscape made up of tunnels, caves and decaying matter. Soil is where 25% of the species on our planet are believed to live; and in this dark, quiet and damp world, death feeds lives. Rotting leaves, fruits,

plants and organisms are folded into the soil and burped out as something new.

Good soil structure provides many nooks and crannies that house organisms which in turn, create an environ-

ment that suits them directly altering and improving the structure of the soil. Like a collection of tiny chemists, they keep soils healthy and productive by passing nutrients between them either by collaborating or killing each other. Complicated food



webs move nutrients around the system thereby generating healthy soils."

It's a fact that soil is at the heart of our existence, and yet we know very little about it. Beyond the knowledge that much of our world's geography has soil that makes it difficult for many plants to survive, we should also be aware that mankind has damaged the fertile skin we call soil by intensive farming, pollution, deforestation, development and global heating. One third of our planet's land has already been damaged through farming alone. The future of soil is in our hands. It will take time, money, better science and a higher level of urgency to turn things around.

Earthworms are the unsung hero of soil diversity. As



they burrow and feed underground, they break down organic matter which is then passed on to smaller organisms. The worm holes create pathways for the water and air to pass through the soil layers. Darwin had a very expressed appreciation for our friend the earthworm. He said that :"it may be doubted if there are any other organisms that has played such an important role in the world as these lowly organized creatures have." There are earthworms in Florida. The two most common are Amynthes Cortein and Gracilis. As you move further North in Florida, these worms become more prevalent. There have been more than a million other soil organisms, but many remain unidentified.

An interesting point of view regarding the health of our soil is offered up by F. Crotty who said that in her opinion, soils can be referred to as "the poor man's rain forest" due to an abundance and diversity of life within the soil. Most of these organisms are the ones driving decomposition and nutrient cycling within the soil.

Soil is the top layer of the earth's crust and is composed of solids, gasses, water and minerals. Topsoil is where 95% of our planet's food is grown and like the rainforest, is extremely fragile. It takes a hundred years to build 13/64th's of an inch of topsoil and seconds to destroy it. Yes. Humans treat soil like dirt losing it a hundred times faster than we can rebuild it. Soil holds twice as much carbon as the atmosphere. When it degrades, much of the carbon is released into the air. Why this is important may be difficult to imagine; but this carbon release into the atmosphere is a contributor to global warming.

So here's my point of view. If policy makers do not understand soil for its importance as a major component to a rich and diverse world, we shall quickly see ourselves in a situation where the price of our food will systematically increase and availability decrease. The depletion of our soil's organic matter will make the food system less adaptable to climate change. Bottom line, our soil is like our pollinators for some of the same reasons. Both situations affect our ability to produce food and in my opinion and in the opinion of others, are being minimized.






