Notes: During the reporting period, \$10,000.00 was transferred from the checking account to the savings account. Interest earned on savings and certificates of deposit during the nine month reporting period totaled \$306.69 Bus trips operate on a break-even basis. The difference in Bus Trips revenue vs expenses is timing.

For these past 13 years Barbara Holdridge has been active and committed to all residents of Southport Springs. I am quite sure Southport Springs residents appreciate Sun Community management and also what our HOA provides for social activities each and every month. Thank you, Barbara Holdridge, for your commitment to our HOA, to our community and for being a big reason we are the community we are today. God Bless You & Everett today and in the coming years.

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Dalgona Coffee Cocktail



Ingredients


2 Tb Instant Coffee 2 Tb brown sugar 4 Tb hot water 2 oz Vodka 2 oz Tia Maria (or Kahlua) 2 oz heavy cream Ice

In a medium large bowl mix the instant coffee, brown sugar and hot water. Whisk to create a fluffy froth (I use a whisk in an electric mixer to save time). It takes about 4 minutes or by hand 20 minutes to get the same results.

In a cocktail shaker add the Vodka, Tia Maria, heavy cream and ice and shake until well chilled. Pour into a coupe shaped cocktail glass and gently top with the whipped coffee foam.

Stir gently to incorporate the foam when ready to drink.

lentify, Fight, and Fix Root

Some diseases are brash and bold. They announce themselves with

symptoms you can't miss or ignore. But Rot Root (RR) is not one of them. It's sneakier. RR starts in your plants root zone, hidden by soil and mulch and stays out of sight until its symptoms advance.

While RR and overwatering go hand and hand, over watering is not the only culprit associated with this disease. Act fast when you see problems and you may overcome the disease. (MAYBE!).

I know once the symptoms begin to show you have very little time to react. Root Rot is a disease that attacks the roots of trees, shrubs, and flowers growing in damp or wet soil. This decaying disease can and most often does kill the plants.

RR often has symptoms like other diseases and pest problems like poor growth, wilted leaves, early leaf drop, stem or branch die back, and eventual death. It is found in containers and in-ground plantings. The smaller the starter plant the more likely it is to suffer

from RR damage or loss.

There are really 2 causes of RR, but the main cause is poorly drained or over watered soil. These soggy conditions prevent roots from adsorbing all the oxygen they require to grow into healthy plants or maintain their expected growth pattern. As the oxygen starved roots rot and die their problem can spread to other healthy plants in the container. Even if the soggy conditions have been rectified. Weakened roots are more susceptible to a soil fungus which is the part of RR that causes terminal damage. The fungus may have been dormant in the soil for a long time when the soil becomes waterlogged, the spores can come to life and attack the roots again causing the death of the plant. Many signs of RR mirror those signs of a pest infestation. Which makes identification difficult. The most accurate way to identify RR is to dig below ground and see if the roots are mushy, discolored, and/or smell like rotting food.

RR is best controlled by prevention. Only plant in well-


drained soil and avoid over watering.

Many people see the symptoms above ground and assume the plant needs water and/or fertilizer which actually causes plant death to occur more quickly and spread to other plants in the container. Should you need me to look at your plants, send a text to 813-838-3668.

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

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

A HISTORY OF OUR CAPITOL.

I have changed the format of these articles. In the future they will be a mix of historical and current information the veterans may need.

From 1776 to 1800 the U.S. Capitol bounced be-

tween nine different cities. This frequent relocation was due to a mix of safety concerns amid the American Revolutionary War and a lack of bureaucratic infrastructure in one centralized place.

Philadelphia first served as the nation's capital (at that time the capital was the city where Congress met and enacted legislation) after the adoption of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. But due to safety concerns regarding a British attack on the city relocated to Baltimore, Maryland on December 20,

1776, and the seat of the government remained there for just over two months.

Congress returned to Philly in March of 1777, but fled once again due to British occupation of

the city.

That September delegates retreated into Pennsylvania settling into Lancaster for a single day and then moving to York PA. After the British departed Philadelphia, it returned as the capi-

tol for a period of about 5 years.

During the Pennsylvania Mutiny of 1783 (an uprising of soldiers over unpaid wages) Congress again vacated Philadelphia and headed to Princeton, New Jersey. Future relocations took congress into the Maryland state house/Annapolis, then to Trenton, New Jersey, followed by NYC. In July of 1790. The Residence Act was signed into law, establishing Washington D.C. as the nations official capitol. It also reestablished Philadelphia as a temporary capital until the city of Washington D.C. was further developed and the proposed capitol building completed. Congress was finally moved to D.C. in 1800 where it remains today.
