



WREATHS ACROSS AMERICA

In 1992, Karen and Morrill Worcester of Harrington, Maine discovered they had a 5,000 wreath surplus at their wreath company. What they did was enlist the help of their local State Senator and arranged to lay the wreaths at Arlington cemetery as a patriotic gesture. By unanimous vote of the U.S. Congress, that launched what came to be known as "National Wreaths Across America Day". On December 15th, 2012, the organization laid its 1 millionth wreath at Arlington. This year, "National Wreaths Across America Day" was observed on Saturday, December 18th. A group of approximately twenty-five Southport Veterans and Patriots joined bundled of others from various organizations at the National Compton in Bushpoll and participated in this hundreds of others from various organizations at the National Cemetery in Bushnell and participated in this time-honored tradition whose mission is to "remember fallen U.S. Veterans, honor those who serve and to teach our children (and grandchildren) the value of freedom. Mary Adele Cluck, Southport's Veterans/Patriot Committee Chairperson shared the following;

"My experience with this event was one of awe and wonder. To see so many come out to honor our veterans was exciting and brought tears to my eyes. There were groups of teenagers, families, children, volunteer groups, community groups and of course Veterans. There were over a 1,000 motorcycles that drove in for-

mation throughout the cemetery. Everyone agreed we would do it again next year.



There's a great book out by R. Anna Lembke, Professor and Medical Director of Addiction Medicine at Stanford University of Medicine. The title of this New York Times best seller book is "Dopamine" Nation" and it deals with the serious consequences of various addictions ranging from drugs and alcohol to the modern day addiction to cellphones and social media. Lembke's book is about the delicate balance between pleasure and pain and why now more

than ever, how critically important it is to find that balance. She explains how we're now living in a time of unprecedented access to high-reward, high dopamine stimuli including drugs, food, news, gambling, texting, sexting, FaceBooking, Instagramming, YouTubing, tweeting etc.
The increased number, variety and potency is stagger-



ing. Dr. Lembke makes it a point to warn that the cellphone/smartphone is the modern-day hypodermic needle delivering digital dopamine 24/7 for a wired generation. As such, we've become extremely vulnerable to their compulsive overconsumption. Not only can this compulsive overconsumption of digital dopamine lead to pain and destruction, the consequences are further compounded by the fact that the information highway is riddled with inaccuracies and outright falsehoods that can be dangerous and destructive. And even more disturb-ing is how these devices can be weaponized and used to destroy individuals emotionally and even physically. We've all seen it in action. People have become so

compulsively addicted to their devices to the point where you often find yourself doing what you can to avoid them (the devices) and the people that use them. They're everywhere; in the supermarket, Walmart, in the doctor's office, in every restaurant, on the beach, on the bus, in school, and yes, even in church and in your living room or at your kitchen table. There's a great story about a father who was so disturbed by what was happening to his family that he purchased a combination cellphone/ internet family plan that he could disable entirely at will which he would do when his family sat down to dinner or during family time both indoors and outdoors.

Critics say that "Dopamine Nation" is both thought provoking and insightful and is available on Amazon.





APPLE PIE AND FLORIDA APPLES

My pal, the Grumpy Gardener has already hollered, "Why would you write about Apple Pie? This is supposed to be an article about gardening!" My response was easy. "An apple is a fruit grown on a tree. Trees live by drawing nutrients from the soil and making food using the sun's energy. They need pollinators to allow the plant to produce fruit and seeds."

The apple is not native to Florida. Apples were first

found in Asia. The sweet, tart apples we're familiar with had spread from Asia to Europe. Later, European colonists brought apples to North America; specifically, the early colonists of Jamestown, Virginia. These early settlers used ap-



ples to make cider (preferred over water and easier to produce than beer). By the early 1800's, many varieties of apples were being grown in America.

Apple pie originated in Europe and is much older than you think. A recipe for apple pie



you think. A recipe for apple pie appeared in a British cookbook over 630 years ago in 1390. Because of the high price of ingredients, a crust was not usually used. During the 15th century, Dutch bakers created the lattice style pie. Early English pies were

quite savory. Other fruits were often added to bring in some sweetness.

The first mention of apple pie in North America occurred sometime during the 1690's and it became part of our cultural identity in the early 20th century. In 1902, an editorial from the New York Times stated that "Apple Pie had become the American symbol of prosperity and the food of the heroic." In 1926, that same publication declared that "the tourists apple pie hunt has ended." American troops abroad had failed to find in Europe the kind of pie their Mom and wives had made at home thus positioning the dish as a distinctly American phenomena. Thus the phrase "As American as Apple Pie" was born. Indeed much like America itself, apple pie is a melting pot of many cultures and culinary preferences. And of course, it's just plain delicious to eat. So back to

central Florida. Apples do grow in central Florida. Start by planting one or more of the LOW CHILL varieties that will produce fruit with just a little winter cold. With good care, they should begin to produce fruit within three to four years. Apples need a chill before early Spring. Without it they will not produce. There are apples that need up to 1,700 chill hours. It's for this reason that these types of apples cannot be grown in Florida. When apple trees do not have a long enough dormant period, fruit production may not occur or the fruit could be deformed. American apples were once only grown in the northern region of our country. However, there are newer varieties that can be grown in central Florida. Florida apples do not self-pollinate. Help is required by honeybees, bumblebees and mason bees; the apple tree's primary pollinators

But get ready for a little work. Start your small orchard by

planting a few of the low chill varieties including the Anna, Ein Shermer, Dorset, Golden or Tropic Sweet. As noted earlier, with proper care, they should begin to produce within three to four years. The new varieties need 300 to 400 hours of temperatures at 45 degrees (or low-



er) each winter. Apple trees grow best when planted in fertile, well-drained soil between December and the middle of February.

Just a reminder. My next seminar is February 24th at 1:00pm in the Southport Springs main ballroom. Our focus will be on planting small pollinator gardens in containers on the porch, patio or in ground beds. We'll have a general "question and answer" session covering all those areas you have an interest in. Looking forward to seeing you there.



and play golf.

A Thanksgiving Day Scramble was held on November 25th with eight team's participating. We also had a Christmas Day Scramble and a New Years Day Scramble.

Here are some golf course updates: All sprinkler control boxes have been replaced and are now fully functional. Sand Traps are being edged and new sand has been placed in them as well.

World Handicap System – Please remember to enter your scores after completing a round into the GHIN system (Handicap Index information is updated daily). The best way is to do it is by entering scores Hole By Hole and it will adjust your scores automatically. The highest score you can take on a hole is Net Double Bogey Plus any handicap strokes a player is entitled to receive based on their Course Handicap (Example - 7 handicap golfer - on Handicap Holes 1-7. The most they could take is 3 over par and on the other handicap holes 8-18, they could only have a maximum score of double bogey.

Golf Etiquette – Please fill in your divots on the tee boxes and also in the fairways. Also make sure that you return carts to the cart path prior to getting to the white/green stakes. For all par 3's, its CART PATH ONLY. I've talked to Earl about seeing some folks with Handicap flags that are driving way too close to the greens. They will be monitoring that and talking to those who are abusing the privilege.

A reminder to all that you need to check in at the Pro Shop before you go out to play golf. The next meeting will be on January 11th at 6:00 pm in the Clubhouse. Thanks again and we look forward to a great season of golf. If there are any issues that arise, please feel free to contact myself or one of the Golf Committee members.




