### A DAY TO REMEMBER AND HONOR



Monday, May 30th - It was a bright, sunny morning when folks gathered at Southport's Veteran Memorial Wall to remember and honor the men and women who served our Nation and who are no longer with us. The flags were lowered to half-staff as our nation mourned the horrible tragedy that took place at a Texas elementary school just six ďays earlier on May 24th when nineteen young school children and two teachers were gunned down by a lone shooter.

Carol Dziki opened the memorial ceremony with a prayer followed by Jim Teixeira who shared a moving reflection in honor of those who have served our country. Tob VanOrman reminded us that Memorial day (originally known as Decoration Day) was first celebrated in 1868 following the Civil War when more than 600,000 Americans perished in battle. Mary Adele Cluck closed the ceremony with a poem and with bowed heads and hands on our hearts, we listened silently to the sound of a bugler playing Taps....


### TO LIVE LONGER, GET STRONGER



### YOUR POLLINATOR HABITAT

Naturally, goals for the outdoor spaces around your home might start with the family's lifestyle in mind, creating a relaxing space on the patio and growing food in the garden. But before long you may notice a community of tiny pollinators that are also calling the place home.

The natural community is vitally important and often goes unseen in an urban setting, especially as many populations face serious decline. But, with

the right plants, amenities like water and shelter plus some intentional choices about pesticide use and garden practices, even a small urban garden can make a huge difference in the lives of our local pollinators and bring them up close where you can enjoy their fascinating diversity and activity.

Here we will share some important components you'll need to create a garden that truly supports a healthy community of pollinators. Pollination is moving pollen

from one flower to another to produce seeds. In some species of flowering plants, wind or rain will transfer the pollen. For most, pollination is an active process carried out by a host of animal species including butterflies, moths, bees, flies, beetles, birds, and some bats. It is a critical part of the process for growing



most of the nuts, fruits, and vegetables we rely on for food. According to recent surveys about 90% of the plants in our natural habitat require active pollinators as



well. These are the plants that provide food and shelter to all living things up and down the food chain.

But while the roll of pollinators is a vital part of our world, researchers have noticed an alarming decline in the pollinator popula-

the pollinator populations across the globe. This includes not only the infamous honeybee but native species of pollinators as well. The exact causes vary but they often include pesticide use, disease, parasites, disruption of migratory routes, and the large loss of habitat due to manmade develop-

ments, and climate changes. Pollinator decline is a worldwide problem with no easy solutions. As gardeners, you can help our immediate community even in the smallest



of urban spaces. We can build pollinator friendly landscapes that provide all the essentials they need to thrive.

Choose a diversity of plants. Partnerships between plants and their pollinators have evolved over time with the two becoming adapted to fit one another well. Plant pollinator

relationships are sometimes so specific that a plant may depend on a single type of pollinator to produce seed. For example, tube shaped blooms are perfectly designed for hovering types of pollinators like a hummingbird or butterfly to reach the nectar with their long proboscis. To attract and support a diverse variety of pollinators in your garden, it's important to plant a wide variety of plants with blooms of different shapes, colors, and bloom times throughout the day or night and various seasons.

Think beyond the blooms. Although flowers are usually the first element that comes to mind in a pollinator friendly garden, pollinators look for other important resources too. A pollinator friendly water source, a shallow tray filled with water



and pebbles, provides a safe landing place for small insects and birds to grab a drink.

Shelter is another important resource for many of our native pollinators. Although insects seem to disappear in the winter, many of our native bees stick around, nested out of sight in dense clumps of native grasses or the hollow stems of spent perennials. So, try to hold off on spring cleanup. Don't forget the larvae. While adult pollinators often feed on nectar and pollen, they also need to find the right food sources to support their young. To maintain a pollinator habitat, we should stop using insecticides at a minimum in the area we have planted your pollinator garden.

There is more to this need than what was written here. You can find information in many places helping you select plants and where they should be planted. All of us eat. It makes sense to start your pollinator garden so this habit can continue. Thanks for reading. Give me a call or text any questions you have.



# **HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS** Tampa Sarasota

Forecasters at NOAA's <u>Climate Prediction Center</u>, a division of the National Weather Service, are predicting above average hurricane activity this year. NOAA's outlook for the 2022 Atlantic hurricane season, which extends from June 1 to November 30, predicts a 65% chance of an above-normal season, a 25% chance of a near-normal season and a 10% chance of a below-normal season. The Center is forecasting a likely range of 14 to 21 named storms (winds of 39 mph or higher), of which 6 to 10 could become hurricanes (winds of 74 mph or higher), including 3 to 6 major hurricanes (category 3, 4 or 5; with winds of 111 mph or higher). NOAA provides these ranges with a 70% confidence.

This is not meant to frighten or alarm you, it's simply our way of reminding everyone that you should always be prepared just in case, but it doesn't mean you need to bring in the lawn furniture a week ahead of time either. Pay attention to local meteorologists (the national ones can scare the hell out of you in an effort not to be wrong). The local guys do a much better job at telling it like it is.
The following Information Sheets and Exit Forms can be found in the Community Office and in the Coffee Cafe.

- 1. The Pasco County Special Needs Evacuation Form. This form is for residents who are wheelchair bound, have medical issues (i.e. oxygen) and/or need transportation. Note: the office will fax this two page form for you free of charge.
- 2. Southport Springs Hurricane Information Packets A one page list of reminders of things to do around your home and a list of items needed for a shelter stay. Hurricane Preparedness packets are available in The Coffee Café and in the Community Office.

3. There's a locked and secured white mailbox to the right as you exit the community. When evacuating Southport prior to a hurricane, complete the short form located in a small pouch attached to the back of the mailbox and drop it in the mailbox. The requested information includes: your name, your lot number, where you're going (family, friends or shelter) and your cell phone numbers in the event you need to be contacted. 




