



GENE POUPARD 1922-2024 In Memory of a Great Friend and Neighbor



Gene was one of more than 16 million Americans who served our nation during WWII; all of whom would come to be known as members of the "Greatest Generation". Today there are less than 119,500 of these brave members of our military still with us who served our Nation and defended our freedom and liberties at one of the darkest hours in history. This past June 6th marked the 80th Anniversary of D-Day when 73,000 American soldiers stormed the beaches of Normandy to assist in freeing France from the grips of Nazi, Germany (2,501 of them sacrificed their lives that day). As a way of saying "thank you", American Airlines flew 70 veterans who were among those who stormed the beaches on that fateful day to this year's Memorial Ceremony in Normandy where French President Emmanuel Jean-Michel Frédéric Macron personally thanked each and every one of them for their bravery and commitment. Back in December 2017, we ran a "*Thank You For Your Service*" article on Gene. As a way of thanking and honoring those who served our Nation during WWII, and as a way of remembering a great friend and neighbor, we thought we

would re-run the article. Thank you Gene for your friendship and your service. And thank you to all you Vets for your service to our Nation. Heroes one and all.



Gene Poupard grew up on a farm in Monroe. MI where he attended Hall of the Divine Child, a private military academy through the eighth grade. He then attended Monroe High School and graduated in 1940. His early education at the military academy along with what was happening in the world (Germany had invaded Poland on September 1st 1939 and two days later on September 3rd, Great

Britain and France declared war on Germany), Gene decided he wanted to join the military and more specifically, he wanted to join the Air Corps. Following his physical, he was told he was under weight and could not be accepted until he gained a few pounds. He was told eating a lot of bananas and drinking a lot of water would do the trick. Not being someone who accepted defeat, Gene embarked on a plan of action. However, before he was able to gain the necessary weight to qualify, one day his brother came running up to the house from the mailbox carrying a letter from FDR telling Gene he'd been drafted into the Army. So off he went to Camp Claiborne in Forest Hill, LA for 13 weeks. Something tells me that those early years Gene spent at

the military academy paid off; because after only a month in basic training, he was promoted to Private 1st Class. After completing basic training, Gene was assigned to the combat unit at Camp Howze in Gainsville, Texas and in November, 1943 he was deployed to Europe assigned to the Yankee Division for Chemical Warfare where he was promoted to T-5 Tech Sergeant. Like the vast majority of those serving during the "War To End All Wars", Gene was in Europe for the long haul. He found himself on the battlefields of France, Germany,



Austria and Italy defending our Nation's freedoms as well as the freedoms of our Allies. He and his fellow soldiers, members of the 103rd Infantry Division liberated the Landau concentration camp located near Welmar, Germany. Gene refused a battlefield commission because he wanted to remain with the guys he'd fought side by side with. He shared a few unsettling stories with me that made me emotional as he spoke. My own Dad served in the Pacific theater during WWII and I remember asking him questions about his war years; and now I understand why he wouldn't/couldn't share them with me. And so it is; Gene's stories will forever

remain between he and I. Among the list of awarded medals for his service are two Purple Hearts.

Gene was discharged in January, 1946. He came home and married his High School

sweetheart Alice. He and Alice met while skating on River Raisin, a local gathering spot for young folks back in the day. But his military story doesn't end there. Gene re-enlisted for three more years and went on to join the Air Force Reserve. This time he didn't have to eat bananas and drink water. The Air Force welcomed him with open arms.

Together, Gene and Alice have 12 children, 26 grandchildren and 13 great grandchildren. Gene was a successful Independent Businessman. He sold Property and Casualty Insurance, was a Financial Planner, A Securities Dealer and a Real Estate Agent. He retired in 1983 at the age of 61. He had (and still has) a passion for antique cars; and I'd venture to guess that his 1926 Model T Touring Car was perhaps his favorite. What an amazing life story. Thanks Gene for sharing it with us. And thanks for your service.

Gene Poupard, What is there to say? There aren't enough words in the dictionary to describe what a caring and wonderful man he was. We all fought to play golf with him because he was such a joy to be around. Gene will be remembered for many things as noted in the above article. However, as a resident Michigan. He was 101 and he played nine holes and shot a 52. That would be the last time he played golf and the last time we would see him. We were looking forward to visiting with him this month when

we were up in Michigan. We look forward to playing golf with you again my friend. In the meantime, rest in peace.

The Statue of Liberty - Ellis Island Foundation, created by President Ronald Reagan in 1982, led to the restoration of Lady Liberty in collaboration with the National Park Service. The project involved a team of architects, historians, engineers, and almost 1,000 laborers.



Restoration was completed in 1986 and on July 4th of that year, President Reagan gave one of the most moving July 4th speeches in history.

President and Madame Mitterrand, my fellow Americans: The iron workers from New York and New Jersey who came here to begin restoration work were at first puzzled and a bit put off to see foreign workers, craftsmen from France, arrive. Jean Wiart, the leader of the French workers, said his countrymen understood. After all, he asked, how would Frenchmen feel if Ameri-

After all, he asked, how would Frenchmen feel if Americans showed up to help restore the Eiffel Tower? But as they came to know each other — these Frenchmen and Americans - affections grew; and so, too, did perspectives....

So, tonight, as we celebrate the friendship of our two nations, we also pray: May it ever be so. God bless America, and vive la France!

And yet, my fellow Americans, it is not only the friendship of two peoples but the friendship of all peoples that brings us here tonight...we celebrate something more than the restoration of this statue's physical grandeur. we celebrate this mother of exiles who lifts her light beside the golden door."




SOUTHPORT NEEDS A NEWSLETTER EDITOR!





PALM TREES

ARE YOU MURDERING YOUR PALM TREES?

You might recall the mention of a so called "Hurricane Cut" that many tree management companies recommended for your palms ahead of future storms during the hurricane season. In reality, this is nothing more than a myth. Don't be fooled into thinking your palms should be trimmed or pruned in that manner to survive a bad storm. Actually, the opposite is true.

Palms were designed to bend and sway with the wind. If not, they would not have survived in hurricane prone areas for long? Trimming the fronds before they completely brown out, die, and fall to the ground is not recommended. This not only starves the palm of vital nutrients, but they now become more prone to wind damage. Green fronds should never be removed because they make food for the entire palm tree.

We are also killing palms by using the wrong type of fertilizer. High nitrogen content lawn fertilizer, like we have used in the past, even when

30 feet away, can eventually kill the palm by causing a potassium deficiency to occur. Fortunately, Pasco County is moving away from this problem soon by banning any nitro-gen in turf fertilizer used on residential turf grass. This is similar to what they've done in Broward County.

The use of processed manures such as that from chickens will also cause palms a problem. Heavy doses of nitrogen often make it difficult for the palm to bring potassium from the roots to the tree's vascular system to the green food

producing fronds where photosynthesis occurs. Palm trees also need many micro nutrients. The lack of them is the cause of many yellow spots on the palm's



fronds. They need to be properly fertilized using a palm fertilizer applied as required on the label. Lethal bronzing disease, once limited to the Caribbean, arrived here less than 2 decades ago, and has spread quickly, decimating thousands of palms. Many of the palms we see in our community such as Queen, Sabal, Phoenix, and nineteen other palm types in Central Pasco County are targets for lethal bronzing. Unfortunately, it's a condition that so far, cannot be stopped once it infects the palm. Numerous pictures can be seen online if you're curious. Injections are expensive and may slow down the disease but will not provide a cure! Many palms have already been removed. Most are cut flush to the ground leaving the root ball in place. If you want to replant in that area, you will need to remove the ball.

Palm death comes quickly, usually within a year from the time of infection. The problem is ongoing throughout our area. Brandon Grooms can cut smaller palms, 813-272-5613, or TJ'S Tree Service, 813-376-5818. There are others, but I've not seen their work. 
A Letter from A Grandmother To Her Grandson





How did fireworks become THE primary form of celebration for Independence Day? The answer to this question eluded me, mostly because I slept through history classes whenever possible. Oh how I prayed for it to be "film day" in history class! Film day was an opportunity to fall asleep while sitting up. I became very adept at this skill during junior high and high school. I am deeply interested in history now, but can't rely upon my

own memory because I slept too much. Please join me in learning the facts of this tradition.

The following text appears courtesy of the American Pyrotechnics Association:

Many historians believe that fireworks originally were developed in the second century B.C. in ancient Liuyang, China. It is believed that the first natural "firecrackers" were bamboo stalks that when thrown in the fire, would explode with a bang because of the overheating of the hollow air pockets in the bamboo. The Chinese believed these natural "firecrackers" would ward off evil spirits.

Sometime during the period 600-900 AD, legend has it that a Chinese alchemist mixed potassium nitrate, sulfur and charcoal to produce a black, flaky powder - the first "gunpowder". This powder was poured into hollowed out bamboo sticks (and later stiff paper tubes) forming the first man-made fireworks.

Fireworks made their way to Europe in the 13th century and by the 15th century they were widely used for religious festivals and public entertainment. The Italians were the first Europeans to manufacture fireworks and European rulers were especially fond of the use of fireworks to "enchant their subjects and illuminate their castles on important occasions".



Early U.S. settlers brought their love of fireworks with them to the New World and fireworks were part of the very first Independence Day celebration - a tradition that continues every 4th of July as John Adams had hoped with "pomp, parade, bonfires and illuminations from one end of this continent to the other". America's spirit of celebration

continued to grow and in the late 18th century, politicians began using displays to attract crowds to their speeches. While July 4th is still the "big day", Americans continue to use fireworks year-round to celebrate festivals, special events and sporting traditions such as the Olympics and Super Bowl.

Fireworks entertainment generates dollars as well as smiles. *Thunder Over Louisville* is one of the country's

largest fireworks displays and an economic study conducted by the Derby Festival determined that *Thunder* generates more the \$56 million dollars for the local economy.

I'm sure there are a lot of folks here in Southport that will be deeply disappointed that we won't be having a fireworks display this year. But while I admit to



enjoying a good fireworks display, I'm perfectly happy to

celebrate without all the noise, smoke and debris that fireworks produce, not to mention the possible inherent danger they present to humans, pets and the wild animals that surround our neighborhood.

So perhaps this year's celebration without fireworks can provide us with an opportunity to create new traditions. And while doing so, we can take the time to focus on the *"reason for the season"* and reflect upon our history and the part we can play in creating sustainable and humane celebrations for all living forms.

May you all have a happy and healthy Independence Day!
