

CAN I BE A BLOOD DONOR?

Broadly speaking, if you're at least 16 years old (and I'm pretty sure we all meet that hurdle), are in good health, feeling well and weigh at least 110 pounds, then you absolutely can be a donor. However, there are a few conditions that would disqualify you from donating which include:

1. If you are suffering from a cold or flu 2. You are suffering or have suffered from malaria. 3. You have recently had a body tattoo or piercing done. 4. You recently took antibiotics 5. You have leukemia or other type of cancer 6. If you are suffering from hypertension, diabetes, a psychotic disorder or have undergone kidney alignments 7. If you are susceptible to cardiac arrest 8. If you are suffering from a blood clotting disorder like hemophilia 9. If you have tested positive for HIV

Please Note: If you've consumed alcohol, you should wait 24 hours before donating and if you have undergone a major dental procedure or have had an immunization, you should wait a least a month.

Medical and technological advancements have for the most part, made it possible to accept blood from donors taking almost all prescribed or over-the counter medications with the exception of the following:

Medications That Disqualify You From Donating Blood

Drugs Affecting Arterial Circulation including Plavix, Ticlid, Effient and Brilinta


Thrombosis Medications including Arixtra, Coumadin and Heparin Blood Thinners including Eliquis, Fragmin, Pradaxa, Xarelto, and Lovenox

Psoriasis Medications (any drug containing acitretin)

Multiple Sclerosis Medications including Aubagio

Hair Loss Medications including Proscar, Propecia, Dutasteride, Avodart, and Jayln. Note: The principle ingredient in these medications is Finasteride which may itself be prescribed for other unrelated conditions. If you are taking Finasteride, you cannot donate blood.

Acne Drugs including Accutane, Absorica, Claravis, Myorisan, Zotret and Zentane

LAWN DISEASE - PART 2

Summer is in the air. Rain, high humidity, and heat are all building in intensity. As days lengthen, plants that received 6 hours of full sun are now getting 9 to 10. In some cases that may be too much.

Rainfall during our winter is minimal, often a stressor to plants. Irrigation during this period is required. Apply 1.5 inches of water to your yard per week if Mother Nature hasn't done it for you.

During the summer, rain is excessive and may also be a stressor to lawns and other plants. Excess water can cause root rot killing plants and/or creating an environment that fosters fungus growth.

Summer in Central Florida is known as an insect's paradise. The recent wave of love bugs is over but other insects are just begging to get started with their season of destruction. Dreams of a beautiful lawn may begin to fade as people realize dreams are one thing and reality is another.

Let's take a closer look. Fungus is always around and

can establish itself at any time. A good question may be "What is a lawn disease"? Many problems in your lawn are probably caused by a fungus of some type. Takeall, which is active in warm humid weather, and brown patch, in cooler dryer times, are our most frequent fungus problems. There are others. Again, remember, fungi have



been in the soil literally forever. Some fungi are good for the turf such as Mycorrhiza. These fungi help plant roots gather nutrients from the soil which are then distributed to other parts of the plant. It has created a symbiotic relationship with the plant.

The fungi in soil such as Take-all and Brown Patch attack the roots first. The grass begins its death cycle as the roots are no longer bringing in water or nutrients. Yellowing grass blades cannot create food without green chlorophyll and the plant dies.

There are fungicides that will help manage fungus problems like Powdery Mildew, Leaf-Spot Disease, Gray Leaf Spot, and many others.

Brown Patch can also be controlled with traditional fungicides. Take-all not so much as it shows good resistance to most fungicides commonly used. The most

effective fungicide I have read about is called Garden Sentinel and is available as a concentrate, or an easier to



work with spray. Apply all fungicide as instructed on the label. A newer product called Heritage G; a spreadable bio-fungicide granule is also receiving great reviews. I've not received information on its effectiveness against Takeall fungus.

Plants that collect leaves at their base have a much greater chance of increasing

leaf loss due to fungus. Ornamental shrubs often pruned wrong keep the base of a plant in

wrong keep the base of a plant in the shade, another contributor to fungal activity. **Note:** pruning should leave the ornamental wider at its base than at its top. Why? If the other way around a wider top keeps the plants base in the shade, increasing fungal activity. Fungi has been around for millions



of years. It will probably be there at least a million more.

For a fungus to spread or become active it needs a host such as your lawn, the right environmental conditions which exist here, and a pathogen such as the fungal spores in your soil. This is better known as The Disease Triangle. All 3 factors must be present for a problem to exist.

Turf Grass diseases we see most frequently were previously discussed throughout this article and some other articles in the past.

Sometimes disease identification is difficult if a fungus problem is in your yard. Here are some tips. When there is a fungus problem in your lawn, it will probably be circular appearing to start. With age the pattern may become irregular in shape.

It will usually have a clear dead zone where the fungus has fed and killed the grass and a lighter yellowish area indicating active fungal growth. As you can now see evidence of dying grass roots, the turf system is under attack and/or dead.

Most diseases begin to take over warm weather grasses like Zoysia, Bermuda, Bahia, Centipede, and the most problematic St. Augustine when temperatures are 70°F and rising. There is also fungi that prefer cooler temps and dryer weather. (continued on pg. 21 LAWN DISEASE)

LAWN DISEASE (cont. from pg. 15)

Applying a commercial fungicide in early winter or after the turf goes dormant is your best safety net against fungus issues. The performance of any commercial fungicide is questionable against Take-all fungus.

Time to review other factors we deal with regarding our lawns.

We (not me) love to fertilize. It is felt that the nitrogen will make your grass grow. True to a degree! Nitrogen will make a greener lawn and push blades to grow upwards. St. Augustine turf is shallow rooted. We need root development for many reasons, all very important. Nitrogen takes plant energy and directs it to blade greening not root development. There are other negatives. Over the years too much growth eventually leads to heavy thatch issues. This, in turn, blocks waterflow to the roots and contributes to another fungus problem. With our sandy soil, nitrogen and other minerals usually are washed away quickly into our oceans, bays, and water ways helping to create Red Tide. Iron will



green up your lawn. Make sure you hold the iron back if there is any risk of rust stains on your concrete. Ironite is used frequently but will stain concrete. Look into a product called Dr. Iron available Amazon. It shouldn't stain. Another product called Feature 6-0-0, is also non staining. Lawns can be a royal pain and, in many cases, the more we do the worse it gets. All

types of turf need on going preventive and corrective maintenance. You may still lose out in the long run.

Let us bounce back to chinch bugs. They are here yearround but less active in cool weather. They eat the blades of green grass not the roots. When done they inject the grass plant with a toxin to kill it off. Why they kill their lunch makes no sense, but it is what it is. There are volumes in libraries and on google regarding all this





One of the many things that sets America apart from all other nations in the world is that we have this thing about commemorative holidays and days of observance. Year after year, we celebrate and observe them because they keep us centered and serve to remind us of a host of important things like for instance; Memorial Day reminds us to never forget those who died so that we might be free; or July 4th when our Nation declared its independence from the tyrannical rule of a

King an ocean away; or Christmas when a child was born that would forever change our world; or Thanksgiving when we're all reminded of how fortunate we are and how we need to take a moment to be thankful for all of God's blessings. And then there are those less dramatic ones like the 3rd Sunday in July when we celebrate National Ice Cream Day or National Popcorn Day on January 19th or Ground Hog Day on February 2nd. Yup, we Americans do love our holidays and days of observance. They're important to us because they keep us grounded and will often put a smile on our face, a tear in our eye or sometimes, an ache in our heart.

One very important day of national observance will take place this month on June 14th when 245 years ago, less than one year after Betsy Ross was asked by George Washington to make our first Flag, the Second Continental Congress passed the following resolution: "Resolved, That the flag of the United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new Constellation." Then exactly 100 years later on June 14th1877, the first National Flag Day observance was held. In the late 19th century, schoolteachers from all over the United States began conducting patriotic ceremonies commemorating Flag Day as a way to teach children about history. One such schoolteacher, Bernard J. Cigrand, is often referred to as the "Father of Flag Day." He lobbied Congress for many years for Flag Day to be officially observed and finally in 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation stating that June 14th would be National Flag Day, and in 1949, it was made official by an Act of Congress.

On a personal note, Flag Day has always been an important day for me. It was an important day for my Dad and the rest of my family as well. My Dad who is now deceased, was a WWII Vet who spent almost three years of his life in the jungles of the South Pacific defending our nation, our freedom and yes, our Flag. I don't know of anyone who revered "Old Glory" more than the way my dad did. When he held it, he held it close to his heart and his eyes told it all. In turn, he passed that same heightened reverence and respect for our Flag down to his four sons. Without a doubt, one of the most memorable days of my life was when I gazed upon his flag draped coffin while the bugler played taps and the guns fired the three volleys. My two living brothers and I each have one of the shell casings and I have his dog tags. I can't think of anything I treasure

So on June 14th, I'll remember my Dad and Old Glory, how much each of them mean to me and how they taught me what freedom, liberty and love of country was all about. There isn't a time that I drive up Gall Boulevard toward Dade City and see that huge American Flag flying over Jim Browne Chevrolet that I don't give a quick nod and say, "thank you". Thank you for all the battles you fought and won defending and preserving our freedom. Thank you for never retreating. Thank you, thank you....

"And the rockets red glare, the bombs bursting in air, gave proof thro' the night, that our Flag was still there."
