The table is Round symbolizing our everlasting concern for our fallen and missing.

The table is set for One symbolizing the frailty of one prisoner alone against his or her suppressors.

The white table cloth symbolizes the Purity of their intentions to respond to their Country's call to arms.

The Single Red Rose reminds us of the Life of each of our fallen and the loved ones and friends that miss them each and every day.

The Vase tied with a red ribbon represents our continued determination to Remember our fallen and find our missing.

The slices of lemon reminds us of the Bitter Fate of those who will never return.

The Salt symbolizes the Tears endured by the loved ones of those who have fallen and those who have not returned.

The Inverted Wine Glass reminds us that they Cannot Toast with us at this time.

The Empty Chair reminds us that they are No Longer With Us.

The Candle is reminiscent of the Light Of Hope that lives in our hearts to illuminate their way home from their captors.

We Remember, We Respect, We Honor...



SPS VET'S COMMITTEE UPDATE



The VA has asked for an historic amount of \$4.1 billion dollars to be used for construction and repair as the VA considers closing some aging medical facilities, some of which are over hundred years old. Much of the money will be used to update facilities that "lack resiliency and sustainability." An inspection program to assess all the

VA's properties is ongoing. Many locations continue to find more facilities that have an urgent need of repair. Work has begun at several complexes. A comprehensive review of all VA properties is deemed vital to supporting their long-term building plan. At this point, the evaluations of all buildings is not complete, leaving the department without guidance for modernizing its health system in the coming decade.

A year ago, the VA released results of a year-long asset review. It's been determined that thirty new hospitals and two hundred and twenty-five new clinics should be built and that some of the underused clinics should be closed. These recommendations met pushback initially from many of those in a decision-making role.

Today the process has slowed but still moving forward. For more information go to Military.com. The article is entitled "**VA Asks for Historic \$4.1 Billion for Construction as the Agency Weighs Closing Some Aging Facilities**", by Patricia Kime.

Here's a bit of Trivia: What is the Pack Act? The **Pack Act** is described as one of the largest benefit expansions

in the history of the Veterans Department and is poised to provide additional benefits and health services to over five million Veterans. There will be more on the **Pack Act** in an upcoming issue. Miscellaneous Topics: The Veterans committee needs more help. Both from patrons and veterans. As we lose our veterans from the Korean conflict and Vietnam era, we need to replace them with younger Veterans. Not only does the work we do now continue; but it will expand over time for numerous reasons.

As a group we are trying to bring you more current information, provide our Veterans Charities with more funding and manage the needs of our Veterans Memorial Park. Again, thanks from all of us to all of you for your continued support and donations.





HUMMINGBIRDS

Describing Hummingbirds without using superlatives is difficult. This family includes the world's smallest birds with the most brilliant colors, fastest wingbeats, and the ability to fly up, down, sideways, and backwards. The brightest colors belong to the males. They spend their time hovering amongst the flowers to sip nectar feeding almost constantly to supply their racing metabolism. After mating, the males take no further role in family life. The female alone builds the nest, incubates the eggs, and feeds the young.

There are well over 300 species of hummingbirds, all native to the Americas. The vast majority are found in the tropics and only a handful of species reach the States. Southern Arizona hosts about 12 species and Central Florida may see 3 species. The most common to us is the Ruby Throated Hummer. The smallest birds in the world

belong to this family. Usually, they range in size from 2.5 to 5 inches in length. All hummingbirds in our region have long, hollow pointed beaks for probing flowers. They use their long tongue, inside their beak, to gather nectar and to snare small insects. Yes, they love insects. More on that later.



Black Chinned

The males are usually first to arrive around mid-March from Mexico, the females return a few weeks later. Hummingbirds, being birds, do lay eggs, the smallest eggs in the world. The eggs are

about the size of a pea. Most often 2 per nest and incubated for two weeks depending on the species. The nest is not much larger than a shot glass. Usually composed of fibrous plant down and moss bound together to a branch with spider webbing. Hummingbirds "decorate" their nests to camouflage them weaving leaves, sticks, and plant fibers on to the outside surfaces.

Hummingbirds are promiscuous breeders. The male courts and mates with receptive females. But the female may mate with more than one male. The young are fed a mixture of nectar and small, soft-bodied arthropods such as spiders and gnats.

There is a reason a hummingbird is always on the move, constantly making food trips. They must eat every 10 to 15 minutes. This means they need to visit between 500 to 1000 flowers per day. Hummers use flower nectar for food. Sugar content of the nectar is about 25%. They're also particular about the texture of a nectar. Since hummingbirds have long tube-like tongues, they prefer nectar that is not too sticky. Hummingbirds also need protein which they get from bugs, small beetles, spiders, gnats, and fruit flies. Ruby Throated Hummers only hunt during daylight hours, "diurnal."

Hummingbirds migrate in large groups called charms. Ruby Throated hummers leave here around October 1st and may migrate around 1200 miles to their winter homes. Their life spans are not long, and many do not live past

year one. Those who mature further can live three to five years.

Being a hummingbird is like driving a car with a one-gallon gas tank. There is a constant need to refuel. Hummers are often remarkably close to the lower limits of their energy supply. On cold nights, when the cost of keeping warm is high, it may be too risky to keep its engine running. At such a time the bird bristles its feathers to allow its body heat to escape, and as its body temperature approaches the surroundings its heart rate drops and it may even stop breathing for minutes thereby appearing lifeless. At day-break, hummingbirds restart its metabolic engines and warms itself again. This sort of temporary hibernation is called torpor. They also enter this state to conserve energy needed for migration.

Remember, they eat more than just nectar. Protein is an important part of their diet. It is not just nectar in feeding bottles that are attractors, nor are the correct plants all you need to keep our hummers in our yards. They also need fresh water and plant cover. A rotting strip of banana peel attracts hordes of gnats. Put it on top of your feeder. The hummers will be your pals for a long time. Power washing just before or while they are here, kills or drives away insects they must have. Also, pesticide use should be stopped. It also kills a hummingbird's food source.

Feral cats are one of the hummingbirds enemies also snakes and praying mantis put hummers high on their favorite meal list. Snakes generally are after the hummingbird's eggs and/or new born hatchlings.






