

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



### Things you might not know about Veterans Day

- It's "Veterans Day," not "Veteran's Day," for a good reason. The lack of the apostrophe might seem like a semantic choice, but it has a definite and deliberate meaning. According to the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs, Veterans Day is not a day that belongs to veterans, it is a day for honoring veterans directly in front of us right now.
- Veterans Day used to be celebrated on the fourth Monday of October. In 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which stated that Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Columbus Day, and Veterans Day would all be celebrated on Mondays. The reason for doing so was to create three-day weekends, which hopefully encouraged travel and other recreational activities that would help stimulate the economy. However, many states did not agree with the change, particularly for Veterans Day, which holds significant historic and patriotic significance. And so, on Sept. 20, 1975, President Gerald Ford signed Public Law 9497, which returned the observance of Veterans Day to Nov. 11, beginning in 1978.





Did Betsy Ross really make the first American Flag?

The well-known story that Ms. Ross sewed the country's first flag at the behest of General George Washington may be apocryphal! (a story or statement of doubtful authenticity, although

widely circulating as being true.) Elisabeth" Betsy" Ross, is famous for making the first American Flag. However, is it true or

just a legend?

Although she reportedly sewed the first flag in 1776, Ross did

not get credit for this work during her lifetime.



In fact, her story was first publicly relayed to the Historical Society of Pennsylvania nearly a century later, in 1870, by her grandson, William

According to Canby, Ross often recounted a visit she received in late

May or mid-summer of 1776 from 3 gentlemen, General Washington, financier of the war Robert Morris, and Colonel

Ross, an uncle to Betsy.

During this meeting she was allegedly presented with a sketch of a flag that featured 13 red and white stripes and 13 six pointed stars and was asked if she could create a flag to match the proposed design. Ross agreed but suggested a few changes, including arranging the stars in a circle and reducing the points on each star from 6 to 5.

The following year, on June 14th, 1777, congress officially

adopted the stars and stripes as the National Flag.

Canby's claim (supported by affidavits from Ross's daughter, niece, and granddaughter) was published in the Harpers' new monthly magazine in 1873 and soon became part of the United States history curriculum taught to millions of elementary aged school children yearly. No official



documentation has been found to confirm that Betsy Ross was responsible for creating the very first U.S. Flag as evidenced by a receipt in 1977 for 14 pounds from the Pennsylvania State Naval Board for making the Ship's Colors. This

invoice was not submitted by Ms. Ross.

Some historians attribute the first flag's design to Francis Hopkins, a New Jersey delegate to the Continental Congress and signer of the Declaration of Independence who also played a role in designing seals for various government agencies. In 1780, Hopkins sought payment from the Board of Admiralty for his design of the flag of the United States of

It must be noted the request was denied on the grounds that he was not the only one consulted about the flag's design.

I thank and credit Laura Schumm for this information.

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

### **MANAGER'S MINUTE**

Dear Residents of Southport Springs,

We hope this letter finds you and your family safe and in better spirits as the cleanup efforts continue at the community. Hurricane Milton created substantial damage to the property and to many resident homes. We know the process to get the community back on its feet will take some time, but we also know that with a good plan and some help from everyone, it will happen quickly. We want to thank everyone for helping neighbors and providing support to those that are in the most need.

As we move to the next step in the cleanup process, here are a few things to note:

- Take plenty of pictures of your home, inside and outside. This is key for your insurance company and to FEMA if you seek government assistance.
- Cleanup crews will be coming through to your home sites removing loose and dangerous aluminum and debris from your homes and home sites. This is important to health and safety and is an immediate danger to the community if left in place. We need to get these items off the property quickly while we have crews onsite. Please reach out to the office with questions.
- If you have the ability and can safely do so, bring items to the end of your driveway or home site so they can be picked up. Please no household rubbish and keep aluminum and other items separate.
- Residents may request PODS or other approved *temporary* storage. Please reach out to the office for approval.
- The office will be reaching out to homeowners with substantial damage over the next few days to check on your safety and to discuss your initial plan. The community is here to assist where we can.
- All exterior modifications and replacements such as new carports, sheds, roofs, etc. require county permits and written community exterior improvement approvals from the office.
  - ⇒ Please do NOT commence work without approval from the office and documentation of approved permits.
  - ⇒ Code enforcement is active in the community and will be as the recovery of the community moves forward.
- Beware of fly-by-night vendors and construction companies promising quick repairs and cash up front
  deposits. We know these companies tend to take money from senior citizens and may never show up
  to do the work. We also know that many vendors are not experts in manufactured housing and may
  try to install non-engineered or permitted carports, sheds, garages and lanais that may collapse during
  a future storm.
- Many of you may have noticed how well our newer homes have performed during this recent storm.
  It's not by accident that these homes and their structures did so well. They were engineered and built
  to do so. We want to make sure that any new structures are built to the same standards for homes that
  were damaged.

We know this storm has impacted so many in the community and the coming days will be challenging; however, we also know that better days are ahead and we appreciate everyone for the kindness and generosity shown to others. Please continue to offer any support you can to a neighbor in need. The Southport Springs Team will certainly do the same.

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### LAWN CARE SERVICES NO OR NO GO?



Lawn care companies can vary in the different services they offer. Some are strictly maintenance providers, mowing, edging, weeding, debris clean up, etc. Cuttings are not usually picked up and bagged. If a contractor will agree to bag, expect more cost.

Some contractors are centered around treatment services, applying herbicides, insecticides, and fertilizers. Ap-

plicators must have certification of training from the state to be allowed to apply these chemicals. Some contractors will install specialty products i.e.: fungicides. A few contractors do both, but it is a rarity. Make sure what you agreed to have done is clearly written.

There is a basic division between the two types of service providers. Most are Florida licensed contractors. Another option is local residence. Usually not licensed but experienced and have done this for years. Some of these have insurance and are licensed. Regardless of who you choose, follow up with their references before deciding. Not all lawn care service providers are the same. Some care more and some care less. Part of that is reflected in the quality of services they provide. Some use better products or better trained personnel.

It can be a tough decision. How do you choose.

If you find yourself staring at your lawn in dismay it may be time to hire a professional to keep the lawn in great shape making sure the proper chemicals are used. You can cut, edge, clean up your cuttings or hire another contractor to do those tasks.

Again, don't make hasty decisions. (to next column)

Check out some of the local contractors you might hire. Ask someone you know that has a good-looking lawn who they use.

Most of the companies that only apply various treatments include pre and post emergent weed treatments, insecticides, and fertilizers. What else is included for the investment you will be making.

Some may provide a fungicide. Some may charge you extra. I would recommend you include that extra in your standard package of services. Some applicators may offer a discount if you ask. Others may not.

"Ask'

A significant amount of damage to our lawns is due to fungus such as Take It All Fungus or Brown Spot. Best to treat fungus preventively where possible in the late fall. Large service contractors will apply fungicide, or you may DIY.

Insects are usually treated separately. Each type of bug will require a specific chemical.

One of the biggest mistakes a homeowner makes is assuming they can just hand off their lawns to the contractor and the lawn is 100% the responsibility of the contractor. The truth is when you hire a company it is at best a partnership. There are many things such as cutting height, proper irrigation, and Mother Nature. That can negatively affect your lawn.

If you have or will have a new lawn the large service contractors should be hired. The proper chemicals correctly installed should keep it in good shape provided all the other factors i.e. grass height and irrigation are not issues. If you have a lawn that is well worn those large companies will not help. No magic can bring it back to

Hope you all have a great holiday season.

Serve in a martini glass and garnish with whipped cream. (I use extra rich Reddi Whip) and fresh grated nutmeg.




