

Local pro golfer found in porta



Wednesday, July 31st - the body of golf instructor and retired pro golfer Norman Putts was discovered in the early morning hours in a portajohn located in proximity of hole 13 on the golf course at Southport Springs Golf & Country Club here in Zephyrhills. Putts' body was discovered at

approximately 6:30am by golf course ranger Dan Jacques. Authorities were immediately dispatched to the scene following a call from Golf Course Manager Earl Hines.

Putts was transported to Advent Hospital where he was pronounced dead upon arrival. It appears that the victim succumbed to multiple stab wounds. Authorities are investigating.

Prior to moving to Southport Springs six months ago, Putts (aka The Silver Fox) was a golf instructor at Shinnecock Hills Golf Club in Southhampton, N.Y.

Note: Medical examiners determined that the victim, Nor-man Putts (aka The Silver Fox) succumbed to 18 vicious stab wounds inflicted by the perpetrator in an apparent fit of outrage. So.....



From the 18th amendment's ratification on January 16, 1919, until it's repeal in 1933, prohibition dominated American society. Most libation lovers were forced to either give up alcohol or acquire it by illicit means, while other curping boozehounds conceived of

cunning boozehounds conceived of clever workarounds. One such individual was British Statesman Winston Churchill, who capitalized on an otherwise unfortunate bicycle accident he had suffered December 13, 1931, while riding down 5th Avenue in New York City. Churchill experienced great pain, for which his doctor conveniently prescribed alcohol as a treatment. It was likely Churchill himself requested this specific "medicine" says Otto C. Pickard M.D. who wrote the following. "Churchill necessitates the use of alcoholic beverages especially at mealtimes, thus permitting the future prime minister to skirt the law during his stateside visits."

Dr. Pickard described the docage as naturally indefinite Dr. Pickard described the dosage as naturally indefinite. But no less than 250 cc's of hooch were needed to be of medical value. Churchill's case was far from unusual as pharmacies often prescribed alcohol as medicine during prohibition due to lucrative payoffs. It was one of several methods Churchill used to finagle his way around prohibition. He once visited an American speakeasy, wryly quipping that he only did so as a social investigator. Churchill's drinking wasn't to be impeded. In the presence of a Saudi King, Churchill used an interpreter to explain his religion. Alcohol was described as an absolute sacred ritual. Smoking cigars and drinking alcohol before, after, and if need be, during all meals and intervals in between. Hope you enjoyed a look back at our past.



THEY DID IT!



They sure did! As you watched these young men in the trials earlier this summer, you somehow knew there was something special going on. They just seemed to click. And so after 16 years, the American men's gymnastics team finally medaled bringing home the bronze. And Stephen Nedoroscik dubbed the "Pommel Horse Guy (the guy in the center) from Worcester, Massachusetts and who trains here in Sarasota, won the individual pommel horse bronze medal as well. The crowd went



wild! Then there's the women's team. What an amazing group of athletes these young women are! They took gold in this year's ğame which would be the fourth time (1996, 2012, 2016 & 2024). And team captain Simone Biles (center)

took home four medals (3 of them gold) making her the GOAT of women's gymnastics with a total of 11 medals (seven of them gold) surpassing Shannon Miller who won 7 medals (two of them gold) and who last competed in 1996 in Atlanta. All in all, the 2024 summer games did not disappoint. And as always, they were amazing and inspiring to watch. However, the jury is still out on break dancing. Really? Break dancing?? LOL

DID YOU KNOW?



that historians believe that the first Olympic flame was lit in a temple built on Olympia by the ancient Greeks in honor of Hera, the wife of the Greek god Zeus in 776BC. In ancient Greek mythology, fire is considered divine. By the way, the Olympic flame is always burnina.

that the modern Olympic games have been played for 128 years. The original games were played for 616 years from 776BC until 392AD and didn't return until 1896 (1,503 years later) when Pierre de Coubertin, a French educator and first IOC President reorganized the games which were held in Athens.





that the five Olympic rings are symbolic of the five continents and the colors were chosen because they appear on the flags of all competing nations.

that the tradition of an Olympic gold medal winner biting his or her medal harkens back to ages past when merchants checked gold coins to make sure they weren't lead forgeries (a lead coin would show teeth marks and a gold coin would not). The last time Olympic medals were made of solid gold was in 1904. Today, silver and gold medals contain approximately 93% solid silver and the gold medal is coated with 6



grams of gold. This years medals (all three) each contain a piece of the Eiffel Tower.



that the United States won 126 medals in this years Summer Games in Paris (40 gold, 44 silver and 42 bronze). That's 35 more than China who came in second and 61 more than Great Britian who came in third.



SPANISH MOSS/LOVE BUGS

I've received numerous questions from residents about varied topics. Here are most interesting the discussions.

1. How do I get rid of Spanish Moss?

It's killing my trees.
A bit of TRIVIA on this topic. It is not a true moss but a Bromeliad*. An epiphyte** not a parasite. Spanish Moss collects all its needed nutrients

from the air. The moss clings to trees and uses it for support. The plant has no root structure; nothing to penetrate the tree and drain away nutrients. Spanish Moss may shade the tree slowing growth, food production and increasing

the weight of its branches during rain storms. In turn, it increases the chances of breakage. This shading may kill sections that don't get enough sun to make food.



The plant is very drought tolerant as it stores water

collected by scales on the needles. It can also go dormant during extreme drought. Fragments break off, become airborne, land and start a new generation.

Spanish Moss is often rumored to have chiggers nesting in its weave. You may encounter chiggers in moss that has laid on the ground. Gloves are recommended when handling the material. If you want the buildup of moss removed from a tree, I suggest you contact a landscape contractor and stay safe. **REMEMBER:** Ladders and plus 65-year-old residents are not a good combination! **STAY SAFE!**

*Bromeliad is a plant native to sub-tropical America having short stem's and spiny leaves. There are 3,475 known species. Pineapples are in the Bromeliad family. **Epiphyte is a plant that grows on another plant but is not a parasite, i.e. Orchids.

2. Where did the Love Bugs come from and why can't we get rid of them?

First, they are not a species that resulted from a University of Florida insect genetics project gone bad. Simply stated they are here via natural migration starting in Central America, moving thru Mexico, and into Texas



and all the Gulf Coast States. We see them when they are mating, which occurs twice yearly. Both periods last about 4 weeks, (May and September). "This is the real reason our friends from the north wait until October to return." Yes, they will be back in September. Love bugs do not bite but are a nuisance.

If they decompose on your car, the remains become acidic and may etch your car's finish. This is more of a problem on older cars. Paint manufacturers have improved the clear coats minimizing damage caused by Love Bugs. They are still difficult to remove. Their Latin name means "Splat". Very fitting. Based on recent studies the Love Bug population is down but still significant numbers remain. Very few were seen this past May.

Males are the first to rise from the fields. They hook up immediately with females when they fly out of the thatch

build up. Males live 4 to 5 days and females 3 to 4 days. The mating process takes hours thus you see most of them stuck together while flying. Here is the sad part.

The male dies after mating and is dragged around by the female until she is ready to lay eggs, then she dies. Love Bugs remain paired for about 3 days. The female is slightly longer and has more girth because she is carrying the eggs. Larvae live in the thatch found in fields and lawns. This thatch is their prime source of nutrient. Adults feed on Sweet Clover, Brazilian Peppers, and Golden Rod. Their greatest predator is a car windshield. There



are a few insects that eat the larvae. Adult bugs have an acidic taste and are avoided by most birds. Males and females are attracted to white surfaces and the scent of spent gasoline. These facts are easily confirmed when you are stopped at a gas station. Watch their activity and where they tend to congregate.





Music excites the mind whether we're one, fortyone or a hundred and one. A positive effect was found for 92% of the individuals included in the trial when they listened to music of their choice. Excitement and happiness were typical reactions to the music.

Songs have the unique ability to instantly create a mood shifting tsunami. When the thunderstorms change your outdoor plans, grab some favorite tunes, retreat to your favorite, comfortable chair and ride out the storm with music. Another fun thing to do is to look for upcoming events that feature your favorite artists (past and present). We recently had a really fun com-






